Celebrating Diversity, Culture and Pride

This half term, our school value is Diversity. At Downsview, we believe that our differences are something to celebrate. Every child, family and member of staff brings something unique to our community, whether that is their culture, language, faith, experiences, interests or family background.

Throughout June, we will be exploring what it means to celebrate who we are and where we come from. This will include our exciting Culture Week, where children will have opportunities to learn about different cultures, traditions and experiences from around the world and within our own school community.

As part of this learning, we will also be recognising Pride Month, which takes place every June. Pride Month is an opportunity to celebrate diversity and to recognise that everyone deserves to feel valued, respected and accepted for who they are. It is also a chance to reflect on how, throughout history, some people have been treated unfairly because of who they are, who they love, what they believe or how they live their lives.

Our assembly will encourage children to think about the importance of respect, kindness and inclusion. We will discuss how families can look different, how people may have different beliefs, backgrounds or experiences and why these differences should never be a reason for someone to be excluded or treated unfairly.

Most importantly, we will remind children that if we want to make a positive difference in the world, that change starts with us. Every day, we each have the opportunity to choose kindness, show understanding, celebrate difference and stand up for what is right.



Small actions can have a big impact, helping to create a community where everyone feels safe, welcome and proud to be themselves.

This message links closely to our school values of Love, Cooperation, Responsibility, Trust, Diversity and Resilience, as well as our Golden Rule of Respect. By learning about one another, celebrating our differences and recognising the things we share, we can continue to build a school community where everyone feels they belong.

As we celebrate Diversity this half term, we encourage all of our children to be proud of who they are, curious about others and confident in the knowledge that our differences make us stronger together.

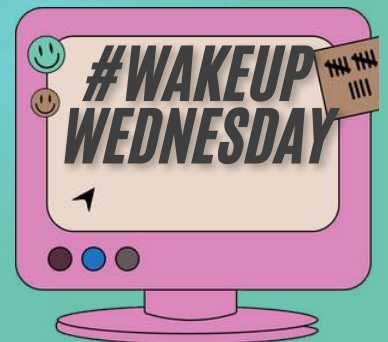

Online grooming is a growing and deeply concerning threat, with thousands of offences recorded each year in the UK. This edition explores how offenders build trust with children through fake identities, flattery, gifts and group chats before exploiting that relationship. It also examines the rise of sextortion and how gaming platforms and social media can become gateways for harm.

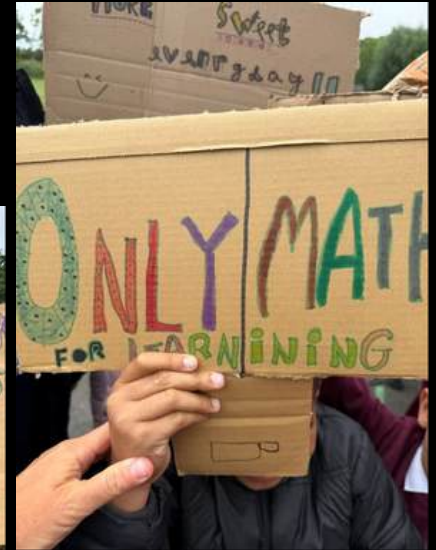
Beyond sexual exploitation, the guide highlights criminal grooming and radicalisation, helping adults recognise that manipulation can take many forms. With practical advice on spotting warning signs, creating open conversations and understanding the platforms children use, this resource empowers parents and educators to intervene early and keep young people safer online.

Live it to learn it!

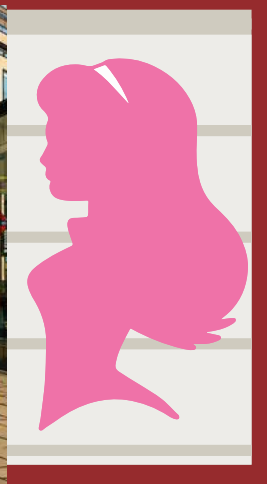

A Dutch court handed victory to ocean defenders

In a landmark case that will ripple across Europe, a Dutch court has ruled that bottom trawling in a marine protected area is unlawful.

Hitherto, the Dutch government has given trawlers a free pass to plunder the Dogger Bank protected area without a permit or environmental assessment.

However, this week a district court in The Hague (pictured) ruled against the status quo. It's the first known ruling in Europe where a court has confirmed that governments have a responsibility to regulate the impact of bottom trawling on protected areas.

The verdict piles pressure on other European nations to phase out bottom trawling in protected areas. Greece has already announced a ban.

"This is a landmark legal ruling for ocean protection, which is set to make waves across Europe," said John Condon, a senior lawyer at ClientEarth, which brought the case. "The Dutch court has unequivocally confirmed that bottom trawling in protected areas cannot be ignored - 'protected' means protected."

How can people create hope during difficult times?

Teenage sisters, Tala and Farah Mousa from Gaza, have created a project called Build Hope. They collect rubble from damaged buildings, crush it, and mix it with materials such as clay, ash, and straw to create new bricks to be used for rebuilding communities. The sisters developed the idea while living in a tent after their home was destroyed during the war in Gaza. Their venture won The Earth Prize, a global environmental competition for young people, for the Middle East region.

How can we protect the oceans?

8th June is World Oceans Day, a time when people around the world think about how to care for seas, oceans and the creatures living in them. Dutch inventor, Boyan Slat, first became worried about ocean pollution as a teenager after seeing huge amounts of plastic while diving. He created the organisation The Ocean Cleanup, which designs special systems to remove rubbish from oceans and stop more plastic entering rivers and seas.

Sharpened Problem-Solving: Every game presents new, evolving puzzles. Children learn to evaluate consequences, test ideas, and adapt their strategies on the fly.

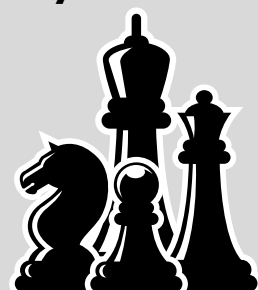

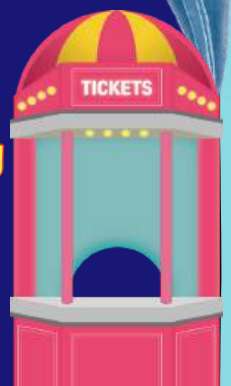
