I would like to thank our wonderful children for **making us smile every day**, for embracing every opportunity and for making us so proud to be part of their journey.

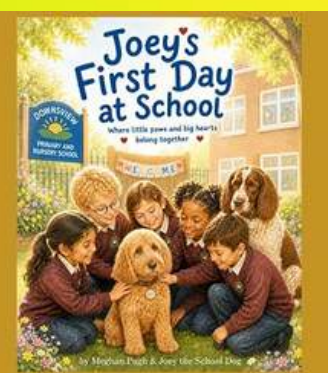
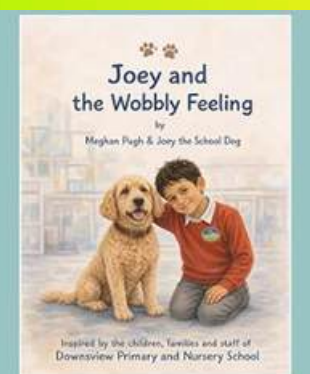

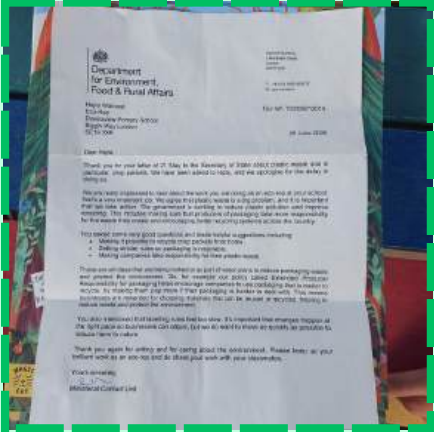
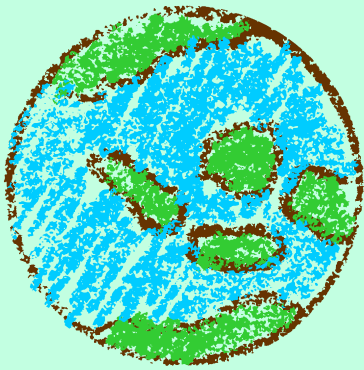
This week we said a fond farewell to our amazing Y6 Eco-Reps! Over the past year they've worked incredibly hard to complete our 2025-2026

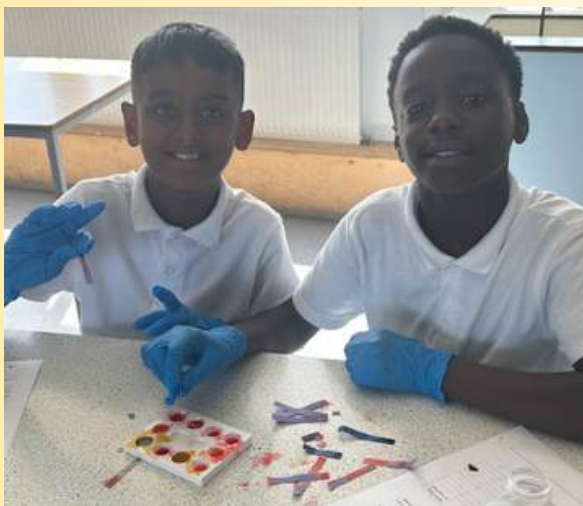
Norbury High School for Girls – STEM Afternoon
